**Sunday, October 7 • 5:00 p.m.**  
**St. Francis Day Choral Evensong with Blessing of the Animals**

Bring your pets and a blanket or lawn chair for this outside service that will be sung by the Cherub, Alleluia, and Good Shepherd Choirs.



**Sunday, October 21 • 5:00 p.m.**  
**Choral Evensong sung by the Raleigh Convocation Choir**

Under the direction of David Arcus, the Raleigh Convocation Choir will sing this candlelight evening service in the English cathedral tradition. This select choir, comprised of musicians from many parishes in the Raleigh Convocation, will sing music by Sanders, Sumsion, Garrett, Knight, and Palestrina.



**Sunday, November 11 • 5:00 p.m.**  
**Heartland Baroque: The Winged Lion and the Unremembered Sea**

This early music ensemble, comprised of musicians from Indiana, North Carolina, Maryland and California, joined by English counter-tenor Charles Humphries, will present a program telling the story of Venice with the sounds of its most renowned 17th-century musical masters and in the words of famed humorist Mark Twain. The program will include works by Monteverdi, Grandi, Castello, and Marini.

**A Service of Nine Lessons and Carols**

This much loved annual candlelight service, sung by the Alleluia and Good Shepherd Choirs, will include traditional carols, hymns, and anthems. A wassail reception will follow the service.

**Prelude to the Ten-thirty Christmas Eve Eucharist**

The Good Shepherd Choir and soloists will sing favorite Christmas anthems and carols.

**Sunday, January 20 • 5:00 p.m.**  
**Michael Stephenson and Friends**

This candlelight concert, the twelfth in memory of Lynn Kronck, will feature Michael Stephenson, soprano saxophonist in the highly acclaimed *New Century Saxophone Quartet*. The concert will include a variety of musical styles from baroque masterpieces to jazz standards.



**Sunday, February 10 • 5:00 p.m.**  
**Alexander Frey**

Berlin based and internationally acclaimed organist, conductor, pianist, and recording artist Alexander Frey will perform an organ recital including works by Bridge, Rossi, Franck, Bernstein, and Korngold. Mr. Frey has performed in concert halls, opera houses, cathedrals, and churches all over the globe with appearances in the music capitals of Europe, North and South America, Asia, and Africa. A *Prague Post* reviewer wrote that "Alexander Frey has had an enormous impact on Europe's music scene over the past fifteen years" and Leonard Bernstein once referred to him as "a wonderful spirit."
